

From the Detachment Leader, Col John Sprouse

Hello from the Ground Forces Detachment.

It is a tremendous honor to be chosen to start the first ever ground-based vehicle detachment of the Commemorative Air Force (CAF). I'm sure that 20+ years ago a few of you would have laughed at the idea of a dedicated CAF Ground Forces unit. Even more so of me being challenged to lead it from here in Gainesville, Texas. Nevertheless, here we are with a fantastic group of people with a common mission to make just such a thing happen.

The Ground Forces Detachment was formed under the direction of the CAF Headquarters in January 2018. It was created as a unit to focus on the integration of ground vehicles, living history, and other non-flying activities into CAF events. Through this, the public will be able to learn about and experience a richer, more diverse perspective of the life and equipment of WWII. We believe that the public has a general love of WWII-era military vehicles and equipment, and that providing equipment and living historians at CAF events allows an expansion of our educational focus to a much broader audience.

To accomplish this, the Ground Forces Detachment will focus on 3 essential strategies:

- 1) EDUCATION. Promote public education of ground forces vehicles, equipment, and historical experiences.
- 2) SAFETY. Partner with CAF units having ground equipment to help them restore and operate safely thus minimizing potential risk and liability.
- 3) ASSISTANCE. Collaborate with CAF HQ to develop and implement policies promoting ground equipment experiences and living history at CAF events.

Over time, we expect to build the Detachment into a community of experts across the CAF to coordinate any repair/restoration of CAF ground equipment, efficiently manage ground equipment parts and parts procurements, safe equipment transportation, and to act as liaisons with our living history friends to execute seamless cross-organizational events that will give the public an entirely new perspective. The community of experts will also help us build a database of ground equipment types and needs that will serve as a support and sharing system that models what we have today for CAF aircraft parts and expertise. Once successful, our education, safety, and maintenance programs will help inspire future generations to take on the mission of preserving history and perpetuating knowledge.

Keep an eye out for us at future events. We'll be the ones on the ground making the flyboys and fly girls look good.

VISION & DIRECTION

The need to form a ground based detachment that could serve the HQ and each individual wing on a national scale has been a works in progress since early 2016. The Ground Equipment and Living Historians provide a strong compliment to the support, event operations, and educational aspect to the current CAF family. This detachment will allow the CAF HQ and all the wings to expand the educational focus to a broad landscape while creating organization and structure on the ground pieces. The direction and operations of the detachment will be focused on several key areas:

- Public Education of Ground Force Equipment through immersive experience
- Asset Inventory & Ground Force Equipment database (Includes of all CAF)
- Safety & Operational Program Development and Training Initiatives
- Ground Forces and Living Historian Event Management and Development Program
- Military Vehicle Operations including Risk Evaluation, Nationwide



THE CAF GROUND FORCES STORY

The driving force and people behind the Ground Forces Detachment have a genuine love for the history of the WWII Era Military Equipment, the Veterans, and the effort to have all these pieces (land, air, or sea operated) live again, and to tell the story for years to come of our greatest generation.

As with the new Ground Forces Detachment logo you will see various elements that define the many pieces that make up the whole. The Commemorative Air Force Ghost Squadron logo forms the foundation. Then you will notice the iconic Non-Direction Tread (NDT) tire as a body of the logo. With the tire as the base of the logo, both the image and the detachment will have a clear focus on ground equipment.



Finally the center crest was derived from the Army Transportation Corps logo. This began back in August 1899 when the War Department created the Army Transportation Service (ATS) which later was assigned to Quartermaster Corps. In 1942 the U.S. Army established the Transportation Corps as a separate branch. The purpose was to oversee transport of all supplies, men, and machine, training, and movement control.

In all past wars overseas where the US has participated, the importance of the Transportation Corps and its operations were ex-



COMMEMORATIVE AIR FORCE tremely vital. Early, and for the duration, all of the upper echelons were actively involved. We understand such focus and importance on this Transportation Corps by the US Army can cultivate and continue in our efforts as the Ground Forces Detachment to restore, recreate, and educate.

Our Mission will always be to Educate our future while Serving our past through our Living Histo-

rians and Military Vehicles and Equipment. We can then accomplish this through our full immersion programs and events. We consist of People, Pieces, and Programs that accomplish our goals.
